A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 primaries and elections generally, so as to provide that direct recording electronic voting
- 3 systems purchased on and after July 1, 2017, shall be equipped with paper audit records; to
- 4 provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

- 7 Chapter 2 of Title 21 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to primaries and
- 8 elections generally, is amended by revising Code Section 21-2-379.1, relating to
- 9 requirements for use of direct recording electronic voting systems, by designating the
- 10 existing text as subsection (a) and adding a new subsection to read as follows:
- 11 "(b) In addition to the requirements set forth in subsection (a) of this Code section, all
- direct recording electronic voting systems purchased for use in primaries and elections in
- this state on and after July 1, 2017, shall produce a permanent paper record of the ballot
- cast by each elector, with a manual audit capacity for such system, which record shall:
- 15 (1) Be available as an official record of the ballot cast and constitute a paper ballot for
- purposes of any recount conducted under Code Section 21-2-495 or any election
- 17 <u>challenge under Article 13 of this chapter involving any primary or election in which</u>
- such system is used;
- 19 (2) Provide the elector with an opportunity to review the permanent paper record after
- 20 <u>casting his or her vote on the system and to change his or her ballot or correct any error</u>
- in such vote; and
- 22 (3) After verification by the elector, be placed securely in an approved ballot box or
- 23 <u>other secured container."</u>

SECTION 2.

25 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
